

PRIDE MARCH ADELAIDE 2019 PARTICIPANT INFO

1. Introduction

Pride March Adelaide is a celebration of the pride, courage, solidarity, history, creativity and diversity of Adelaide's LGBTIQ+ communities. Everyone is welcome to participate, as long as they are not transphobic, homophobic, bi-phobic, sexist or racist and respect the rights of Queer LGBTIQ+ Peoples to gather in public.

Individuals do not need to register, but we ask that groups and businesses register so that we can plan the logistics of the March.

Registration is free and can be done via the online form at the Pride Adelaide website <http://prideadelaide.org/participate.html>.

Pride March is held on Kurna land and we pay our respects to elders past, present and future and acknowledge that sovereignty was never ceded.

2. When and Where

Pride March Adelaide 2019 will be held on **Saturday 2 November**.

We will gather in Light Square / Wauwi from **5:30pm**.

We will march to Victoria Square / Tarndanyangga at 6:30pm, via Morphett St and Gouger St. A map is available at <http://prideadelaide.org/route-map.html>.

The March will be followed by a party spread across multiple venues in the CBD. The cost to attend will be \$5. Further details will be announced at <http://prideadelaide.org> in September.

3. Who Can March?

Any individuals or groups may participate in the march to express their support for our LGBTIQ+ communities. Individuals who walk do not need to register, but we ask groups and businesses to register, so that we can plan the logistics of the march.

4. How to Register

Registration is via an online form available now at <http://prideadelaide.org/participate.html>.

Registration is free.

Registrations are due by midnight **Sunday 29 September**. We will then contact you via email in the following weeks to confirm details of the assembly point and your position in the march.

It is vital that the email address you include on your registration form is one that you check often.

5. Motorcycles

The march is led by the motorcycle contingent.

Permission will be granted by SA Police for motorcyclists not to wear helmets on the march. There will be a truck with a DJ on it at the assembly point. Helmets may be stored in the cabin of the truck for the duration of the march and collected at the finishing point.

Motorcyclists must wear helmets before and after the march.

Motorcyclists must travel at walking pace – not more than 5 km/h.

Motorcycles must be registered and roadworthy.

Motorcyclists must have a current license and third-party insurance.

Motorcyclists may have a passenger.

6. Vehicles and Music

Pride March Adelaide encourages groups to utilise vehicles and music in the March. Due to limited road space at the gathering point, groups are limited to one vehicle each (emergency services excepted).

This year Pride March Adelaide is able to provide sound systems and vehicles for a small number of community groups in the March. 7. Access

The march route is flat and wheelchair accessible. Assistance can be arranged to enable people with mobility issues to participate in Pride March Adelaide. For further details please contact Eric via email kuhlmann.eric@gmail.com or phone 0402 010 093.

8. Safety and Prohibitions

Safety is of absolute importance. Please follow all directions from Pride March Marshals and Police.

The following are prohibited:

Fire – Open flame, fireworks, flares, fire batons, fire breathing, sparklers etc.

Projectiles – Nothing is to be thrown at people – you may hand things to people.

Loose Glitter – Lethal to animals and the environment when washed into our waterways.

Racism, Sexism, Homophobia, Transphobia and Biphobia – No racist, sexist, homophobic, transphobic or biphobic language, materials, imagery or behavior.

9. Laws and Authorities

Participants must comply with the law, including traffic laws and directions from Police and Pride March Adelaide Marshals. Please note that the march route is within a dry zone – the police may fine you if you consume alcohol along the march route.
