

PRIDE MARCH ADELAIDE 2016 PARTICIPANT INFO

1. Introduction

Pride March Adelaide is a celebration of the pride, courage, solidarity and diversity in our LGBTIQ communities. Everyone is welcome to participate. Individuals do not need to register, but we ask that groups and motorcyclists register so that we can plan the order of the march. Registration is free and can be done via the online form at the Pride March website <http://prideadelaide.org>.

2. When and Where

Pride March Adelaide 2016 will be held on Saturday 22 October.

We will gather in Light Square / Wauwi from 5:30pm.

We will march to Victoria Square / Tarntanyangga at 6:30pm, via Morphett St and Gouger St.

3. Who Can March?

Any individuals or groups may participate in the march to express their support for our LGBTIQ communities. Individuals who walk do not need to register, but we ask groups and motorcyclists to register in order to help us plan the logistics of the march.

4. How To Register

Groups and Motorcyclists are asked to register so that we can plan the order and logistics of the march. Registration is free. Individuals do not need to register.

Registrations are due by midnight **Sunday 25 September**. We will then contact you via email in the following week to confirm details of the assembly point and your position in the march.

It is vital that the email address you include on your registration form is one that you check often.

5. Music and/or Vehicles

Pride March Adelaide encourages groups to utilise music and vehicles in the March.

6. Motorcycles

The march is lead by the motorcycle contingent.

Permission has been granted by SA Police for motorcyclists not to wear helmets on the march. There will be a truck with a DJ on it at the assembly point in Rymill Park. Helmets may be stored in the cabin of the truck for the duration of the march.

Motorcyclists must travel at walking pace – not more than 5 km/h.

Motorcycles must be registered and roadworthy.

Motorcyclists must have a current license and third-party insurance.

Motorcyclists may have a passenger.

7. Mobility Issues?

Assistance can be arranged to enable people with mobility issues to participate in Pride March. For further details please phone Margie 0417 863 717.

8. Safety and Prohibitions

Safety is of absolute importance. Please follow all directions from Pride March Officials and Police.

The following are prohibited:

Fire – Open flame, fireworks, flares, fire batons, fire breathing, sparklers etc.

Projectiles – Nothing is to be thrown at people – you may hand things to people.

Loose Glitter – Lethal to animals and the environment when washed into our waterways.

Racism, Sexism, Homophobia and Transphobia – No racist, sexist, homophobic or transphobic language, materials, imagery or behaviour.

9. Laws and Authorities

Participants must comply with the law, including traffic laws and directions of law enforcement officers and Pride March Adelaide Marshalls. Please note that the march route is within a dry zone. The police may fine you if you consume alcohol along the march route.
